The Awardee is required to get admission and registration for regular and full time M.Phil./Ph.D. course in a University/Institution/College recognized by UGC at the first available opportunity but not later than three years from the date of issue of this award letter. University/Institution/College is requested to process for award of JRF based on this letter, in accordance with the procedure available on www.ugc.ac.in/netjrf.

It may be noted that the fellowship amount shall be disbursed through Canara Bank to bank account of the Awardee (any bank) directly. UGC has developed a dedicated web portal (<https://scholarship.canarabank.in>) for capturing data of the awardee. The Universities/Colleges/Institutions will link the data of the awardee with the master data on the UGC web portal with unique Maker/Checker IDs which have already been provided to them along with the passwords. The Universities/Colleges/Institutions shall update the information in the master data (regarding monthly payment confirmation, HRA, up-gradation, resignation etc.) of the beneficiaries on monthly basis.
