Programmes on cultural, regional, linguistic and socioeconomic diversities

University organises a number of cultural, local/regional, linguistic programmes to encourage the concept of "unity in diversity" and to foster a sense of belonging among its employees and students coming from different racial, ethnic, and linguistic origins. 






Performance of Chanakya Play 19.10.2019




